In the rural villages around Daloa, women cannot own land and are discouraged from attending the local Fairtrade cooperative meetings. They farm and harvest cocoa, which the men sell. Awa Ouedraogo, a particularly inspiring, passionate woman in the video, explains, "The land, that belongs to the men. . . we don't earn anything from it. . . We suffer too much." Aya Solange Konan echoes the women's hope for a better future, "If the [Fairtrade] cooperative could help us, our dream is that one day we will be landowners—that lots of women will become landowners." Fairtrade has already seen some progress in this area, as Ama Sabine Sie now serves as the cooperative's director. Sie explains that with "morale and strength" she gained the respect and support of the men in her community. Fair-trade practices are about creating opportunities for marginalized communities. As Awa proclaims, "Women and men, we all have the same potential," and by receiving fair wages these women may be able to reach their dream of becoming landowners, educating their daughters, and leading the cooperative to help future generations of women.
