Day 26 Greenest Challenge

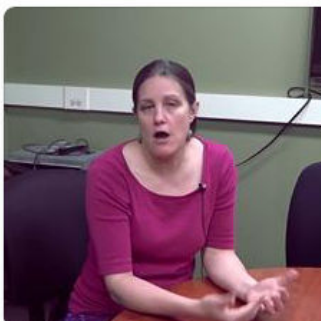
