### Trashless, Classless

The Project Green Challenge today is to collect all the trash you make throughout the day. As a sustainability steward at College of Idaho, however, I didn't make ANY TRASH. (Really unusual) It might be because I was extra conscientious today about my consumption- usually I make tea in the morning which has a teabag as trash or compost. Sometimes I finish off food in my fridge and have to recycle or throw away whatever container it was in. Today, however, I ate only leftovers and used food out of containers but didn't make new trash. Sometimes, I'll admit, I leave my reusable cup at home and make a coffee cup as trash. Most days though, I have a reusable coffee cup, utensils and plates that I use throughout the day both at home and abroad. This significantly

reduces the amount of trash I make and today it meant I didn't make any. But I still wanted to compete in the challenge so here's what I did:

# Canal Cleanup

Instead of feeling really good about my day without trash, I felt like I was cheating the system. I still wanted to show how trash is impactful and WHY I strive not to make any. I decided to take a walk to clear my head and within the first few minutes I found the ground was littered with cans, bottles and straws. It wasn't mine but HERE was some trash! I started picking up cans as I walked along guessing that I might stumble upon a plastic bag. Lo and behold, as I was walking past some escaped chickens, I found a Big Smoke plastic bag. I filled it with my cans and started to pick up all the trash I could find. Within 15

minutes it was filled to the brim with trash! Mostly, it was filled with beer cans and bottles but there were also some straws, lids, paper and plastic. Unfortunately (or fortunately, depending on how you look at it) most of the items were recyclable. After I was done photographing them I was able to put them in the recycle bin. While the presence of this much trash in so little time was impactful, even more surprisingly were the fuzzy friends I met along the way.

#### **Ecosystem Impact**

As I walked along the canal, I found that many different animals lived in the trash that I was collecting. I ran into a bunny, chickens, and a plump (a grouping) of ducks! Who knew so many animals were dependent on this area that many humans think is ugly, ignore, or, as I found, use as a landfill. ## My Commitment

I also will buy looseleaf tea

instead of bagged tea to reduce the non-recyclable paper trash I create on a daily basis.
