manure)



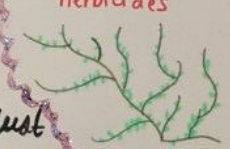

think



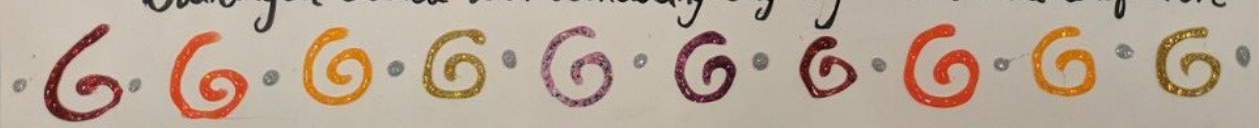
The weeds of conventionally
