



**LOOK BEYOND CERTIFICATIONS**. Learn which brands positively impact the communities where they operate and source from.




**READ LABELS.** Determine which ingredients (and what percentage of those ingredients) in the product are certified fair trade.






Day Twenty-Four | Greener Challenge

First, watch this video explaining the basics of the Green New Deal. If you live outside of the US, research if your country has a similar, major climate action plan in the works. What are its most important components? Is there anything you would like to see added or removed? What issues do you think should be addressed first? Next, write a letter to your elected officials urging them to enact a climate action plan. Tell them why we need a Green New Deal (or equivalent) *now* and highlight its importance to you and which areas of focus resonate most and why.

Post a PDF, screenshot, graphical representation or snippet from your letter on Instagram with a brief caption. Tag the elected officials to which it is addressed, as well as @TurningGreenOrg and #PGC2020. If you reference the Green New Deal, tag @AOC and @EdMarkey with #GreenNewDeal too!

### What are its most important components?

- The Green New Deal is separated into two main parts: what America needs to do NOW (set of goals) and how we should achieve those goals in a way that is fair to all
- It includes provisions to cut all gas emissions (get to net-ZERO = "after tallying up all the greenhouse gases that are released and subtracting those that are sequestered, or removed, there is no net addition to the atmosphere")
- Create millions of gree, high-wage jobs
- Secure clean air, water, and food to residents of the United States
- Ensure a just transition to sustainability by stopping current, preventing future, repairing historic oppression of indigenous peoples, communities of color, migrant communities, and all other "frontline and vulnerable communities"

Is there anything you would like to see added or removed?

- I would like to less of the exception language "where technologically feasible"
- I would like to see more SPECIFIC detailed language that explicitly states what companies, politicians, and everyday Americans need to do

What issues do you think should be addressed first?

- Gas emissions! These need to be cut NOW if we even have a chance at staying under the 2 degrees C deadline
- Justice! We need to bring how underprivileged communities will be affected to the forefront of this proposal
