Title of CAP Project: Sustain and Sprout

CAP Summary Overview: Our CAP project, Sustain and Sprout, worked to close the loop on food waste through sustainability and community engagement. Our system transformed everyday food scraps into compost, which nourished plants in a community garden, creating a cycle: scraps to soil, soil to plants, plants to plate, and plate back to scraps. Our planted vegetables were either used in our school cafeteria or FACS classes to make nutritious meals. We hosted workshops on making "seed bombs" using leftover items like old paper, compost, and native plant seeds. We also learned that engaging other individuals with experiential experiences such as seed bomb workshops can create genuine interest in green action.
