



**What does it need to survive?**


**It need its eggs to be protected and a safe source of food**

to be eaten.**





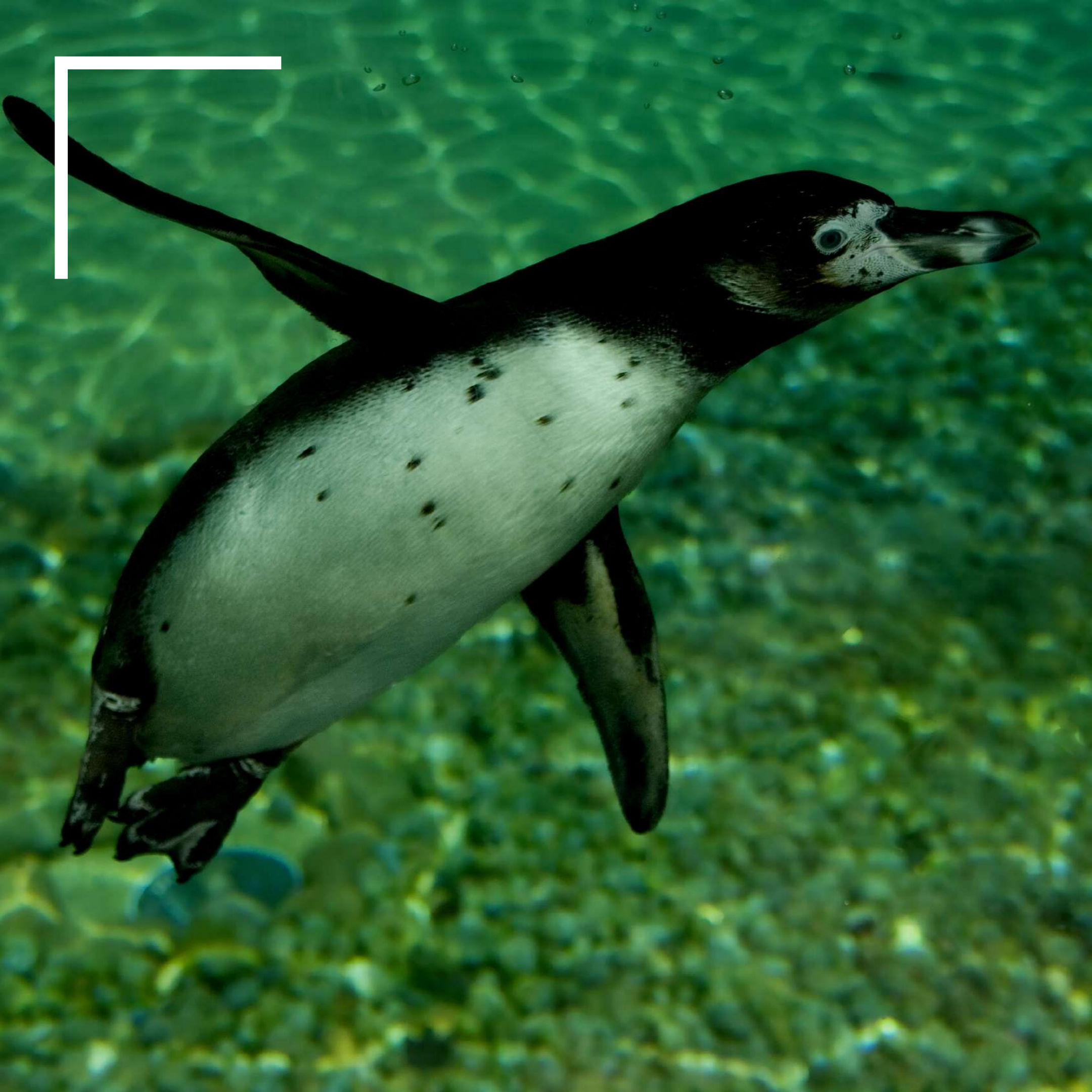


# 3 things we can do to help protect this species
