Name: Federico Gutierrez

What office are they running for: Federico Gutiérrez, is running for the right-wing candidate of Team for Colombia. However, he doesn't want to be categorized as such.

2 policy issues they have addressed and where they stand: He proposes "prison, political death and loss of office" for officials guilty of corruption. He aspires to create anti-mafia laws and a "National Unit Against Robberies". In the fight against drug trafficking, it proposes substituting illicit crops for agricultural development, and promoting the concept of addiction as a public health problem. He plans to support the demobilized guerrillas, but says he will fight dissidents. He wants economic growth of 5 percent of GDP for Colombia until 2026, in a "responsible fiscal and monetary environment", with austerity in public spending and the fight against tax evasion. It is also committed to the "Colombia without hunger" strategy, guaranteeing three meals a day to the poorest.

Personal position and why these issues matter personally: My personal position is that these issues are important to be able to address. I think that the anti-mafia laws would reduce the violence percentage in the country by a lot. I believe that agricultural development is very important and this can help accomplish this economic growth. Finally,

by providing meals to the poor, they might be able to get up on their feet and get a job. All of these issues matter because as they are seen in Colombia they are also seen all over the world. Because of this, a movement could be initiated and an example could be set!

What office are they running for: He represents the League of Anti-Corruption Rulers (populist)


