The Ogoni struggle is a universal fight for **corporate accountability**. It proves that the link between environmental destruction, climate change, and human rights is real. Allowing corporations to destroy a people's homeland and silence their advocates sets a dangerous global precedent.

Call to Action: Support reputable local Ogoni organizations engaged in community-led oversight of the UN-mandated clean-up, and pressure European governments to impose strict liability laws on multinational oil companies for all environmental damage they cause overseas.
